Come to the 21st Annual Clinical Meeting of the American Academy of Pain Management, September 21-24, and look at pain management in new and engaging ways.

Explore the latest science surrounding pain management through interactive and didactic sessions. Learn to practice the art of pain management through thoughtful, hands-on workshops.

Keynote presentations on mindfulness-based stress reduction, pain and consciousness, and the role of glial activity in chronic pain will frame this meeting.

Expert faculty will explore neuropathic pain, arthritis, pelvic pain, headache, back pain, fibromyalgia, and other disease states, and describe both pharmacologic and nonpharmacologic approaches. Building upon our success at the 2009 meeting in Phoenix, faculty will talk about patient-centered care, and the role of diet, nutrition, and exercise in pain management. Functional restoration techniques, such as graded imagery, will also be discussed.

The pre-conference day will feature a cadaver course for those interested in learning more about interventional therapies. A popular course on hypnosis will be offered at a basic and advanced level. Robert Rhode, PhD, will conduct a three-hour workshop on motivational interviewing and, Jay Shah, MD, will lead a four-hour workshop on dry needling for myofascial pain. We will also offer a seven-hour didactic program on opioid prescribing on the pre-conference day.

The American Academy of Pain Management is accredited by the ACCME to provide continuing medical education for physicians. The Academy is also approved by the American Psychological Association to sponsor continuing education for psychologists. Additionally, we seek approval for several other disciplines, including acupuncturists, counselors, dentists, family physicians, naturopathic physicians, nurses, pharmacists, physical therapists, and social workers.
